Soon, Ralph started another company—HPG Real Estate Consulting—to focus on project development, site selection, land acquisition, portfolio management, real estate financing, and capital solutions.

Leveraging his expertise in government, real estate and finance, Ralph has been able to create strong partnerships between public and private entities to develop large-scale community-driven projects.
